## MINUTES OF SELECTMEN'S MEETING JUNE 27, 2017

Chairman Hevy called the meeting to order in the Senior Center at 6 PM with Mr. Kiley and Mr. Petraitis also present.

## I. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

- June 13, 2017
- June 20, 2017

Mr. Petraitis moved, and Mr. Hevy seconded, a motion to approve these minutes as written. So voted, with Mr. Kiley abstaining from voting on the June 13<sup>th</sup> minutes.

### II. APPROVAL OF WARRANTS

- School Warrant #1062 for \$48,849.66
- General Warrant #1063 for \$117,691.97
- Payroll Warrant #27 for \$275,711.30

Mr. Kiley moved, and Mr. Petraitis seconded, a motion to approve these warrants. So voted.

## **III. FINANCIAL ITEMS**

## A. Transfer requests

There were no transfers.

## IV. OLD BUSINESS

There was no Old Business.

### V. NEW BUSINESS

## A. Town Offices lease

The Selectmen reviewed a new three-year lease for the Town Offices at 215 North Main Street. (Available in the Selectmen's office) The rent is \$2,532.40 per month for the entire term of the lease. Mr. Kiley moved, and Mr. Petraitis seconded, a motion to approve and sign the lease. So voted.

### B. NBEMS contract

The Board reviewed a new one-year contract with the North Brookfield Emergency Squad, and also an amendment that provides for ALS services. (Available in the Selectmen's office) Mr. Kiley moved, and Mr. Petraitis seconded, a motion to approve and sign the contract and the amendment. So voted.

### C. New fees for town departments

The Selectmen reviewed new fee schedules for the Town Clerk, Selectmen, Building Inspector and Fire Department. (Attachment #1) Mr. Kiley asked about the Wiring and Plumbing Inspectors, and was told that they had just raised their fees in the past year or so and did not feel that they could do it again. Mr. Kiley moved, and Mr. Petraitis seconded, a motion to approve the new fees and to see that they are listed on the Town website. So voted.

## D. Annual Appointments

The Selectmen reviewed the listing of Town Officials to be appointed for the new fiscal year. (Attachment #2) Mr. Kiley moved, and Mr. Petraitis seconded, a motion to appoint as read. So voted.

#### E. Award annual road materials bids

This item will be deferred until the next meeting.

## F. Bills in state legislature

Mr. Petraitis presented two bills that have been filed in the State Senate. (Attachment #3) The first bill "prohibits the use of Native American mascots by public schools in Massachusetts", and the other is a bill to "protect the civil rights and safety of all Massachusetts residents." In Mr. Petraitis' opinion this second bill would make Massachusetts a "sanctuary state." He stated that crime rates are up in sanctuary cities because of illegal immigrants. It is not a safe environment for the legal citizens.

Mr. Kiley said that a former law enforcement official he is against making the state a safe harbor. He would like more information on how this might affect us financially. Representative Don Berthiaume was in attendance, and said that this bill had a very contentious public hearing, and that he plans on voting no.

Representative Berthiaume stated that the bill regarding Native American mascots probably won't go anywhere. In some arenas the name can be seen as a badge of honor and not something offensive, and there is not a lot of support in the legislature for this.

The Selectmen thanked Mr. Berthiaume for his input.

## G. Potential changes to Right to Farm Bylaw

Mr. Kiley presented a copy of the state's Right to Farm Law, which falls under zoning regulations. (Attachment #4) The Town's Right to Farm By-law does not have language that would require that animals are confined to an owner's property. He would like to ask the Planning Board to amend the by-law to include language regarding fencing capable of keeping animals in, along with graduated fines. Damage is occurring right now to property and there is nothing in the current by-law that will allow the police to step in. Mr. Kiley will work on some language for the next meeting.

## H. Roger Davis re: solar projects

Resident Roger Davis of Bell Road was present to speak with the Selectmen about his objections regarding plans to build solar projects on town property. Mr. Davis stated that he is representing Citizens for Sensible Solar, a group opposed to the projects. Mr. Davis read from a prepared statement (Attachment #5) which said that his group opposes any and all solar projects which would require the destruction of woodland or other natural habitat.

Mr. Davis also presented a petition signed by 414 people objecting to these projects. Mr. Kiley asked that Mr. Davis have the petition validated by the Town Clerk in order to ascertain how many of the signers are from North Brookfield.

Mr. Davis stated that there is a 10% reduction in property values for properties located near solar facilities. Mr. Kiley asked how Mr. Davis came up with that number, and Mr. Davis said that it was only his estimation. Mr. Kiley said that he understands the point about property values, but town services benefit everyone and cost a lot of money. We need to increase revenues in order to provide these services. Mr. Hevy stated that the Selectmen are looking for ways to generate more revenue.

Mr. Davis said that the developer might spray pesticides under the panels, which will contaminate the soil. Mr. Kiley noted that his family has a large solar installation, and the grass is mowed under the panels, not sprayed. Mr. Davis said that he did contact Melink, who stated that they could stipulate that there be no chemicals, but Mr. Davis said that who will be watching to make sure that it does not happen?

Mr. Kiley stated that the Board met with Mellink recently, and they agreed to look for possible alternative locations to be developed in addition to the ones already discussed.

The Board thanked Mr. Davis for his input.
