# MINUTES OF SELECTMEN'S MEETING SEPTEMBER 27, 2016

Mrs. Walter called the meeting to order at 6:05 PM in the Senior Center with Mr. Hevy and Mr. Kiley also present.

#### I. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

#### • September 20, 2016

Mr. Kiley read these minutes. Mr. Hevy moved, and Mr. Kiley seconded, a motion to accept the minutes as read. So voted.

## IV. FINANCIAL REPORTS

## A. FY18 Budget Policy and Calendar

Mrs. Walter noted that the Selectmen are meeting with the Finance Committee tomorrow night, and will review the draft budget calendar with them. Mr. Hevy stated that he would like the FinCom's feedback on the policy and guidelines as well.

# V. OLD BUSINESS

# A. Requests for AED

The Selectmen reviewed information from CMRPC on their bulk pricing for AEDs. CMRPC has a price for one with text and voice prompts of \$2,355.76. The Board of Health had obtained an AED in March for \$1,654.00. Mr. Hevy said that he will speak with Mr. Kiritsy of NBEMS for a recommendation on what type of AED to purchase.

## VI. NEW BUSINESS

## A. Request for appointment to Planning Board

Mr. Hevy reviewed a letter from the Planning Board asking that James Grace be appointed to fill the vacancy left by the relocation of Steve Cummings. (Attachment #1) Mrs. Walter noted that the appointment would only be until the next election. Mr. Grace was present, and said that he briefly served on the Planning Board in the 1990s, and feels that he would be an asset to the Board. Mr. Hevy moved, and Mr. Kiley seconded, a motion to appoint Mr. Grace to the Planning Board until the May 2017 election. So voted.

## B. Water Department request for appointment

Water Superintendent Rich Kennan and Water Commissioner Jim Kularski were present to ask the Selectmen to appoint Kelly Valeri as their new Administrative

Assistant. (Attachment #2) Since Ms. Valeri was not present, Mr. Kiley asked that the men tell the Board about her. Mr. Kularski said that Ms. Valeri is from town, and was chosen from six finalists. Mr. Hevy moved, and Mr. Kiley seconded, a motion to appoint Ms. Valeri as the Water Department Administrative Assistant. So voted.

## C. Review/sign Special Permit Application

The Selectmen reviewed special permit applications from Melink Solar, LLC for the four solar projects being proposed for town property. (Attachment#3) Mr. Hevy moved, and Mr. Kiley seconded, to sign the applications as the owners of the property. So voted.

## D. CIP and financial forecasting follow up

The Selectmen discussed an e-mail from Monica Lamboy of the Collins Center asking when the Selectmen would like to hold an open meeting for town officials and residents regarding the financial forecasting project that the Collins Center recently did for the town. (Attachment #4) Ms. Lamboy had offered October 17, 18, 19, 24, or 27 as potential dates. The Selectmen agreed that a Monday or Thursday would be preferred. Leslie will get back to Ms. Lamboy to tell her that the Selectmen have decided on October 17, 24, or 17 as the best dates.
